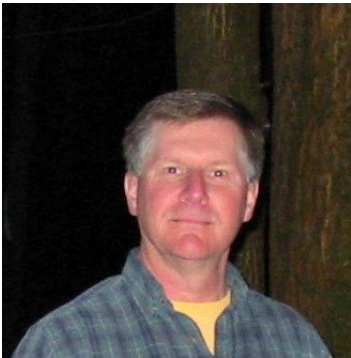

President's Message



Hello everyone, in a little over two years Mazda will be releasing the next generation of Mazda Miata. As you can imagine, Mazda is holding their cards pretty close to the vest when it comes to letting out any information about the new ND. But rumors have been floating on the internet. Here are some of the rumors that keep recurring and may have a grain of truth.

First rumor and most credible, the new Miata will have a direct injected engine. These engines have very high compression ratios, very high horsepower for their size, and return excellent fuel mileage. News around the 'net have the new Miata at 180hp returning 30-40 mpg on regular gas.

Second rumor, the new Miata will have a optional Dual Clutch Transmission. This transmission is a manual transmission with no clutch pedal, electronically shifting faster than can be done by human input. Currently, only high price sport cars such as Ferrari and Porsche use this transmission.

Third rumor, the new Miata will get a major weight reduction returning to its original svelte 2100lbs using high tensile steel for chassis strength in lieu of standard bracing.

The fourth rumor, and probably least credible, the new Miata styling will have sharper creases than previous generations. No more jelly bean look. But really, no one knows at this point what the car will look like. Mazda always holds as it's dearest secret what the new car will look like until the very last minute.

Now, if you add it up, we have a sports car that will weigh 2100lbs powered by a engine producing 180hp on regular gas. This would mean performance numbers of 0 to 60 in 6 seconds and a quarter mile time in the low 14 second range. This would be considered muscle car numbers just few short years ago. The most amazing number? The new Miata will do all this while returning 30-40 mpg. If the new Miata equipped *as rumored* sells in the current price range, then I think Mazda will have another huge hit on their hands. Certainly, the Miata will pick up a whole new generation of enthusiasts.

But what about you, the current owner? Would you trade in your faithful Miata for a car that will be quite a bit faster? Or would you stay with the car that has provided so much fun in the past. That's something we can talk about the next time we meet for ice cream. Until then.....

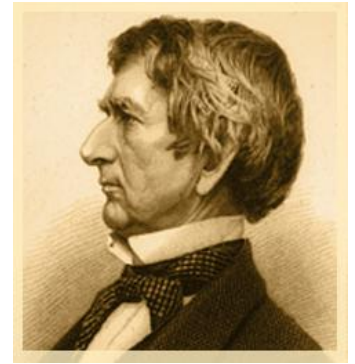
HE SHAPED THE NATION

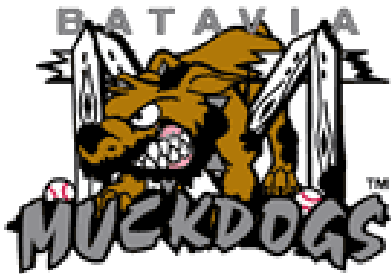

Seward, who lived much of his adult life in Auburn and was secretary of state under Presidents Abraham Lincoln and Andrew Johnson. Seward negotiated the deal with Russia in which the U.S. bought Alaska on March 30, 1867, for \$7.2 million.

OK, so you buy a convertible and all you can think about is all the top down driving you'll be doing. The wind whipping thru your hair, the radio blasting, the engine roaring, the tires squealing, ooh yaaa, this

Then reality sets in, we live in central NY. So there are times that the top, begrudgingly, has to be up. Therefore top maintenance is a necessity. Since most of us have vinyl tops, this advice is for them. (Cloth tops have their own set of issues that need to be dealt with, and I'm trying to please the mass's here, sorry Bob).

So what do you do? Well, wash it. The car wash soap you use is fine, just make sure you rinse all the suds away. You'll also want to crack the top a bit every now and then by releasing the front latches and opening it a couple of inches, this will release the tension on the top and allow you to run a damp rag between the side of the top from behind one of the doors, below the zippered window, continuing to the other door. You'll be amazed at how much crud can accumulate in that crevice over time.

After the top is washed and dry you'll want to protect it. I'm a firm believer in 303 Aerospace Protectant. This is great stuff and works on rubber, vinyl, fiberglass, tires, plastic and leather. It puts a low sheen coating on whatever you apply it too. I've found that other products leave too glossy of a shine, especially on the interior, and seem to attract dust sooner rather than later. This seems to be a super product that the marine industry has known about for years. What that means is that it's tough to find outside of a marine supply store. It's also a little pricey, but does it really matter? I've been using the same 32oz bottle for the last few years now, so it does go a long way.

So be nice to your top, since you never know who might see you not naked.
