President's Message



Sometimes it is difficult to decide what to talk about in my column, and other times a subject is so prominent that it can't be avoided. Unfortunately in this case, it is the latter. I had hoped that I would not need to talk about this again this year, but unfortunately I must.

The subject is club participation and the canceling of events. As Treasurer of the club for many years, it was my job to always be concerned with making sure everyone was “getting their money's worth”. It was important that the club was meeting the needs of the membership and giving back to its members.

However now as President, I feel even more responsible for making sure that the members are happy, and that the club activities are enjoyable and well attended. In past years, we could usually count on there being at least 8-15 cars at an event. However this year, although we have one of our largest memberships, we have also been left to wonder if anyone is going to attend.

When it comes to benefits like club discounts, there's only strength in numbers if those numbers will actually show up. We have already cancelled several events this year, and unfortunately there may be more cancellations to come . . . This troubles me, does it trouble you?

The club's leadership, area reps, and event coordinators try their best to supply a large selection of different and interesting activities throughout the year that people say that they want, and will attend. However, it seems that we have had to cancel more and more events due to lack of participation. I have to ask, what are we doing wrong? Are there too many events? Are they the wrong events? If so, what event do you want?

We commonly need advance commitment for events because a restaurant is involved. Are people unwilling to commit, thus they don't let the reps know they plan on coming? Or are people just not interested in eating at events anymore? Was the price of gas, food or the economy the problem? Was an event too expensive? When food is involved we try to keep the prices down when possible, and we always make sure that all costs are clearly mentioned in advance so there are no surprises.

We try to keep you informed via emails, the newsletter, the website, and by the local reps contacting you directly. However, I hear some people say that “nobody reads the newsletter or looks at the website”. If so why not? How do you feel about being contacted by the reps? Are you contacted too much, or too little? Are you not

contacted at all? Does the way they contact you (i.e. phone, email, etc.) need improvement or change, if so how? Do you have a recommendation?

Were there events that you wanted to attend this year but were unable to? If so, why? Were any of the events too far away?

We have had many new members join this year. If you are new to the club, did you attend an event, and if so, did you feel welcomed by other members? Are there beneficial things from other clubs, that you have been a member, which might be incorporated here?

We work very hard to try and supply events for you to enjoy, and we hate having to cancel events. If you want to help, it's simple. Please participate. Let your rep know, in a timely fashion, what event(s) you are going to attend.

October 14, Sharon Springs/American Hotel

Jerry Willis will lead an event to the American Hotel and surroundings in Sharon Springs on October 14th so please call your area rep by September 30th if you are interested in attending. The group will meet at the McDonald's in Fayetteville at 9:30 in the morning for a 10:00 departure.

Once the playground of Vanderbilts, Roosevelts and Rockefellers, Sharon Springs was a bustling society watering hole in the mid-

19th century.

The American Hotel was built by Nicholas LaRue of Esperance in 1847 to cater to the glitterati of the time: Oscar Wilde gave porch-side readings; Ulysses S. Grant stayed at the former Pavilion Hotel. Eventually, the gentry began to build their castles in Newport, the Adirondacks and Bar Harbor and take the waters while in Saratoga Springs for the races.

Sharon Springs then languished briefly, but a new group started to come to town for the healing chalybeate, magnesia and sulfur waters: wealthy Jewish families who were not welcome in Saratoga; By the mid '60s, however, the town went into decline with fewer and fewer visitors coming to the grand hotels, many of which declined into tear-down state. The American struggled along as a hotel until the mid-50s and then was used as a religious retreat until its closure in 1989.

The American Hotel stood vacant, abandoned and in deplorable condition until Doug Plummer and Garth Roberts saved it from almost certain demolition when they bought it in 1996. Five years and hundreds of thousands of dollars later, the American reopened as a hotel and restaurant. The excitement at its opening has ushered in a revitalization and new excitement in Sharon Springs; new businesses have opened up, new hotels are planned.
