

UPDATE: We have 2 couples signed up so far. October 20 will mark 90 days to the sailing. Typically at that time, whatever cabins are left typically go on sale, so check the Royal Caribbean web site (or with your travel agent) to check on prices. Cabins often go quickly at that point. If you book after that time, you will need to make full payment. Join us on the cruise to St Somewhere!

This is something new. Tired of winter here in CNY? Go south. When I retired a few years ago, I vowed to never spend an entire winter here. With 2020 being the horrible exception, it has worked. For 2022 it will be the "Cruise to St Somewhere" and you are all invited.

The cruise departs from Cape Liberty (Bayonne), NJ on Jan 20. It is the 11 night <u>Southern Caribbean Cruise</u> with <u>Royal Caribbean</u> on <u>Anthem of the Seas</u>. Ports of call are San Juan, St Martin, St Johns, St Lucia and St Kitts (hence the St Somewhere moniker).

We have sailed on this ship and have been to each of these ports before and can confirm a good time. Sailing from New Jersey means no having to fly to the port; you can just drive there the day of the cruise, no worries about schlepping luggage and a couple of sail days each way to lounge on board. The Anthem is amazing – with bumper cars, indoor skydiving, a surfing wave, climbing wall, great shows and food.

Fares vary by room type. Recently the fare was \$895 per person for an interior cabin (with a virtual balcony), \$1,113 for an outside cabin and \$1,419 for a balcony. With \$392 in taxes and port fees and discounts, that is \$1,937 for two people in an inside cabin. Fares change daily and there are often sales. We paid a total of \$2,632 for our balcony cabin. Add in about \$300 in tips plus whatever else you choose to spend on optional drinks, casino chips, upgraded meals, port excursions etc.

Be Cool!
Flush & Replace Your Engine's Coolant/Antifreeze

One of the fluids in our Miatas that we take for granted is the engine coolant (also called antifreeze). Mazda and most auto manufacturers recommend *flushing* and replacement on <u>older cars</u> every two years or 30,000 miles, whichever comes first. (Consultant your owner's manual for interval replacement.)

If coolant is not flushed regularly, especially in older Miatas, or any older vehicle for that matter, one of these symptoms may appear:

- Engineer overheating
- Coolant loss through leaks
- A sweet odor inside the vehicle
- No heat from the heater

Old coolant or a faulty coolant system can result in overheating of the engine, cylinder head gasket failure (\$\$), engine block failure (\$\$\$) or cylinder head warping (\$\$\$\$).

If you haven't flushed or replaced your coolant in some time or have no idea when this was done, consider making an appointment with your mechanic or D.I.Y. as soon as possible.

A little background info from *The Wench*:

WHAT IS ENGINE COOLANT?

Engine coolant, also known as antifreeze, is a heat transfer fluid designed to remove excess heat from your engine and contains additives that will keep the water from freezing in cold winter weather, as well as overheating in any temperature. It's made up of a combination of ethylene glycol, water and inhibitor or glycol and water normally in a 50/50 ratio. Engine coolants come in many different types. When it comes to picking the right engine coolant for your car, consult your owner's manual recommendation, don't just use anything you may have on the shelf in your garage. Aluminum blocks and aluminum radiators in modern cars need specialized coolant and not just plain water.

WHAT DOES IT DO?

The engine creates a lot of energy and heat while the car is moving. It's the job of the exhaust and cooling system to make sure the engine stays cool. The coolant absorbs the heat from the engine and stops the engine water from boiling in the summer. In addition, it also ensures metal parts don't rust and rubber or plastic parts don't corrode.

WHY IS ENGINE COOLANT SO IMPORTANT?

Without the coolant, the heat produced during constant internal combustion would ruin the engine very quickly. Although coolant is mixed with water, the water alone isn't able to keep the engine cool. The heat of the engine would eventually start boiling the water or the summer heat would evaporate it.

Coolant can deteriorate over time and should be tested to see if it's still good as it can be hard to tell just by appearances. Even if the coolant reservoir shows a sufficient coolant level and testing shows the cooling protection is still adequate, a coolant drain and flush may be needed.

THE IMPORTANCE OF GETTING A COOLANT FLUSH:

Coolant flushes provide many benefits to your cooling system. It is important to maintain your cooling system to keep it working efficiently.

What are the Benefits of a Coolant flush?

Coolant flushes remove rust and scale deposits that build up over time. It's important to get rid of these deposits because they can cause overheating and damage your entire cooling system.

Over time, old coolant loses its anti-corrosive properties allowing for contaminants to build up in the cooling system. Getting a coolant flush will completely clean these particles from the system. Fresh coolant contains additives that work to lubricate the water pump, help extend its life and also help prevent rust from building up in it allowing the cooling system to operate more efficiently.

When you get a coolant flush or coolant replacement it is also common to receive an inspection of your entire cooling system including the thermostat, radiator, plastic coolant reservoir in an NC Miata (2006-2015) and all hoses and belts. If

not, ask for one. This is beneficial because a thorough inspection checks for leaks and other potential problems. Preventative automotive medicine is a good thing! ©

And finally, getting a coolant flush will prevent the old coolant from becoming acidic, important because once engine coolant begins to become acidic with age, it will break down and damage the water pump, rubber hoses and the aluminum components of the engine.

DO IT YOURSELF OR HAVE "BUBBA" DO IT?

If you're at all mechanically inclined, flushing and replacement is not difficult, just time consuming: jacking 'er up, getting down underneath to drain, flushing, filling and checking and disposing of old coolant responsibly. There's lots of good videos on the Internet/YouTube that explain step-by-step. I've done it: it's not hard.

If you have a repair shop or dealer do this for you, expect to pay between \$100.00 - \$200.00 for a flush and replacement with new coolant. If you take what I have written above to heart, it is certainly money well-spent, considering possible catastrophic repairs.

And by the way, if you are an NC Miata owner (2006-2015), please read my archived article on our Miata Club website about replacing your plastic coolant tank with an aluminum one. If the pressurized plastic coolant tank leaks or ruptures with age, coolant is lost and so is your engine!

I hope this has been interesting and useful info.

Take care of your Miata and it will take care of you!

My Retirement Package

Back in early 1996 as a single man with a good job, I lost two friends who were in my age bracket (51) which made me think about my future. They both went due to natural causes, so I wondered if there were things going on under my skin that could suddenly show up and change my retirement plans which were still out there a-ways. At that time, I drove a pickup truck so I could carry whatever needed to be carried, bicycle, motorcycle, canoe, whatever. Having had a used '66 Corvette coupe which I bought after I returned from Vietnam in '68 and subsequently had to give up after a couple tickets in the early 70's, I began to think about my remaining time, and wouldn't it be nice to have a sports car again.

Not being able to afford a Ferrari, I took a look at a few two seaters in my price range, but also thought about my single car garage. Ruling out anything British (had an MGB one time after the Corvette...enough said), I decided to check out this newer vehicle called a Mazda Miata.

During a lunch break at work, I drove my pickup up to Burdick's on Route 11 in North Syracuse. They had three unsold '95's on the lot, two white ones and a blue one. The salesman asked what color I preferred, tossed me the keys and said take it for a ride. It was the blue one with leather seats. With the top down, it probably took me all of 15 minutes to make up my mind. I had brought along my checkbook just in case and made the down payment. The '95 had what I wanted, so back to work and take care of financial stuff required when ya don't pay for the whole package upfront. Then it was off to a foot race, maybe up Mt. Washington in New Hampshire. Yes, I 'towed the line' a number of times back then.

Back the next week, all the paperwork was complete, Burdick got the money, and I got dropped from work by a buddy again at lunch time so I could pick up my new 'toy'. A bright sunny day, I drove it back to work on Northern Boulevard, stopping at the traffic lights, smiling all the way. While stopped, a tractor-trailer pulled up next to me, and I was looking at the height of the trailer tires and realized the Miata could almost completely fit under the trailer. OK, one of those reality checks we go through. Back to work, fellow workers came out to look at the Miata with the Oohhs and Aahhs.

From that day on, I drove it to work and other places when it was going to be sunny and nice. It did get driven when rain fell if required, but I still had my pickup for daily travel. It even had some snow on it once when coming home from someplace, maybe even a Miata Club event. To this day (August 28th, 2021), this format continues. Course it has some miles on it now (53,252...that's right, fifty-three thousand two hundred fifty two). Yeah, it doesn't get driven much now, even then too. Remember the title of this article? Have to make it last for however many more wake ups I'll get. Plus got a new bigger pickup to tow the trailer camping, carry kayaks, bicycles, skis, other stuff. Could even get a trailer and tow the Miata. Hmm.


So, that's the story of why and how I got my Miata, but we all know that as time marches on, things can change (remember my days of running... happy doing my walks now). One of the things that requires some maintenance in the early Miata's is the timing belt. The recommended mileage point to get a new one is 60K. It's not something I was looking forward to, but it was on the to-do list downstream.

Then I noticed some oil spots on the garage floor. Not much, but they were there. I continued driving the Miata always keeping an eye on the dipstick. Lots of miles to go.

Then I noticed what looked like coolant dribbling out this spring. This was more serious. I could not find any leakage points up on the upper part of the engine...it was coming out of the lowest hole on the belly pan. I thought aboutputting the car up on jack stand and crawling under like I would have done years ago, but not being as agile or flexible, I was hesitant even though I've got many metric tools left over from my days of motorcycle riding/racing/turning wrenches (sorry Gail). It was 'pay-the-man' time.

Well, do everything at this one moment and get the Miata back ready to roll another 25 years. What they found was a coolant leak at the thermostat housing (replaced), oil from the main seal on the rear that accumulated in the transmission bell housing (replaced components in the housing that were oil soaked). Oh yeah, while doing this why not do the timing belt. Throw in various pulleys for the timing belt, gaskets, clamps, O rings, thermostat, coolant, oil and filter, and I just handed them my charge card and gritted my teeth. Let's see, this part of my retirement package just took a hunk of change from the other retirement package, so it must be OK, right? Maybe I can say I just shifted some funds around...works for me.
